Another way to Equip & Engage...

Equip and Engage: a Story of High Hopes by Pam Mitchell



One especially hot day last summer I stopped at the public library as I often do. I got out of my car and, because of the heat, I was eager to get inside. But while walking across the parking lot, something caught my eye: An interesting person you might ask? A fender bender? A lovely area of shade? Nope, none of these! While walking across the parking lot, I saw an ant. Yes, an ant. Stay with me now.

Right here I will admit to being at the age where I read large print books whenever possible, so it was pretty amazing that I would spot that little thing ten feet away. A little black spot on a yellow curb. But I did. And this tiny little ant was about to make my day!

Immediately I discovered this was not an ordinary ant . . . it was an ant on a mission. We all know enough about ants to know they often take on spectacular feats, like hauling something ten times their body weight! Unfortunately, this was not a *spectacular feat* moment for this ant.

I walked closer and stood there watching in complete awe while the little bug tried to ascend the five inch curb. With each attempt - and I am talking A+ for perseverance - it would get right up to the top where the curb rolls into the sidewalk, then it would fall. Over and over and over. My mind is playing the old, OLD song *High Hopes* right now. Anybody with me?

Bugs are not really my thing, but I watched the situation and witnessed the sheer determination of that ant, never giving up, and in my mind picturing its family waiting and wondering what was taking so long. I knew I could help and make a difference, waiting family or not. So, on the next attempt, I used my finger to very softly nudge the ant over the hump. Once it reached the sidewalk, there was no *thank you*, no turning back with last looks, just a speedy retreat to a cooler place.

I hope you are smiling as you picture this, but you might also be wondering what this story has to do with being equipped and engaged. As I thought about this story, this is what came to mind: An ant is such an ordinary thing. It goes unnoticed most of the time. In our busy lives, we don't often stop to rescue ants. But our God is a God of the ordinary. He cherishes even the most mundane and ordinary parts of our lives, and he uses ordinary people to accomplish amazing things. He knows when we need help and even when we feel unloved and unnoticed. He shows us when others around us feel that way, too. He says, *Trust me, and I will give you every single thing you need.* Through His Word, He equips us to love others, to help others, and to step up and make a difference. We are equipped to do so, and He calls us to do just that.

I helped that little ant because I knew I could; I just had to make the decision to engage. Pay attention. Be deliberate. God is equipping each of us to use our gifts to engage, even in the most ordinary of circumstances.

The youth ministry's goal is that 90% of students are coming back each week because that means they have a desire to be there and that the group is important to them.

We are measuring retention, engagement, and growth by the amount of deep questions asked and students talking about God, Bible, or something we learned about.

Garrett and I found a summer church camp to send students to; our long term goal is that this will become our home church camp where all of our students will go each summer to build relationships with other campers, encounter Jesus, and of course have fun.

I personally got my substitute teaching license to be able to get inside the schools where all of my students spend most of their time. The purpose of this is to build relationships with students that already attend 3TC and spark an interest with students who are not here yet.

Outside of youth group, Pursuit is building a community that does life with one another; this looks like hanging out outside of church and youth group, and encouraging one another at school activities. I am rolling out a discipleship model with one student in the high school to go deeper on some biblical topics. This is a six week one-on-one series meant to make disciples who will make disciples. The hope is that this high schooler would then go on to disciple someone else. This is engaging and equipping put into action.

This summer is the Mission Trip! It looks a little different than years past. We are going off of the scripture Acts 1:8. Year one we will be going local. Year two we will be somewhere in the state of Nebraska. Year three we will be in the U.S. and Year four we will be out of the country. Then the cycle starts over; if a high schooler goes every year during their high school career, they will have hit all four spots.

Worship & Creative Arts Ministry - Vision 2022

The beginning of each year is a great opportunity to set new goals while eagerly looking forward to the days ahead. This is no mystery to any of us, that's why we all set New Year's Resolutions - because without a clear goal, there can be no clear plan of action. For this reason, our church leadership was encouraged to lay out our goals and the vision for each of our ministries that we felt God was leading us towards. For the worship and tech team, I believe that God is calling us towards a handful of goals.

WORSHIP TEAM

NEW SONGS - First, for our worship team, we are going to continue to implement new songs that are theologically sound and that are speaking to the universal church. While we strive to implement these songs and we are always looking for ways to keep the music fresh, our goal is to implement them at a comfortable pace.

Taking this a step further, we have also begun the process of writing original songs as a worship team. This is for two reasons. First: it will provide a creative outlet for the worship team that lets us worship God in a context specific to where we are at in our lives. Secondly: who better understands our church than the members of Three Timbers. As the worship team is a sample size of the congregation, we believe that we will be able to effectively write music that is relevant to the time and place 3TC is currently in.

FULLY BUILT & ROSTERED TEAM - Secondly, it is my prayer, and I strongly ask you to pray about it as well, that we can have a fully built and rostered worship team by the end of 2022. What does that look like? My vision for the whole worship team structure is shown on the left.

Before I dive into the "why" of this set up, I want to finish laying all the groundwork. If you look at our current team structure you'll note that we traditionally have this:

Meaning we would need to add one more guitarist, one more keyboardist, and a drummer. But if you notice in the title, I said built AND rostered. A full roster would be three people deep in each position. So if you take the end goal,

minus our current situation, that means we are looking to add: 4 more guitarists, 3 more drummers, 3 more keyboard players, and two more bass players.

That's all fine and good, but why? Simply put, this arrangement gives us the opportunity to play most any song while maintaining the dynamics the songwriter originally intended, while also keeping the door open for inserting our own team dynamic into the song. The reason we want three people rostered in each spot is so that our worship team members can be scheduled at a rate that allows them to still spend time worshiping in the congregation instead of on stage.

IEMS & MUSIC STANDS - We are looking to de-clutter our stage by removing music stands and implementing a new monitoring system. These processes have already begun and should be fully implemented soon. As mentioned above, doing this will de-clutter the stage, will help the team engage more in worship, and will make the lives of our sound team members much easier for mixing the front-of-house.

MONTHLY TEAM BUILDING - The worship team and tech team will be replacing one of their weekly rehearsal times with a fellowship evening once a month. This is happening so the team can build deeper relationships with each other and to also give everyone a break from the usual routine. We have tried this a few times now and have had a lot of fun at each.

EXTERNAL PRESENCE - Lastly, we will be looking to have more of an external presence in the community through events like Bennington Daze and other community events. This will be done for fellowship and outreach purposes.

TECH TEAM

TRANSITION PRESENTATION SOFTWARE - Over the last two months we have fully transitioned out of our old presentation software (ProPresenter) to a new software (Proclaim). This was done to streamline the presentation creation process, provide presentation software to our whole team, and to lower the barrier to entry onto the tech team.

NUMERICAL GROWTH - Just like the worship team, I would like to see our tech team grow in numbers so that our current team can have additional help. For this, I would like to see our Sound Team grow by five and our Presentation Team grow by five. For those of you keeping track at home, that puts us at about eight team members on each team, meaning each volunteer would realistically only have to volunteer once every six weeks or so.

TRAINING PROGRAM - I would like to implement training throughout the year that helps to further equip our Tech Team in their understanding and skill set regarding running sound specifically. Running a sound board can be a very intimidating thing and we have some great resources to help our team. These events would happen on scheduled days.

To wrap all of this up, and I know it's a lot, the primary goal of our worship team is the same this year as it was last year: to help usher in a place of genuine worship through praising our King. The method of striving towards that goal is ever changing. I know the vision can seem lofty, but I also know that we worship a God who can see it through if it's in his will. I would like to encourage you to pray over a decision to join either our worship team or tech team. If you feel called to do so, please reach out to me. If you want to learn an instrument or improve upon your instrument, please don't hesitate to reach out to me as well. I can make sure we find a time to sit down together and grow together

To all my current volunteers on the worship and tech teams, I want to thank you for all the hard work you put in week in and week out to make Sunday mornings happen. I say it all the time but I genuinely mean it, I am so blessed to get to lead worship with you all.

God is calling you to something.

It may be to the worship team, and it may not be, and if it's not, that's okay.

But whatever it is, I encourage you to dive in.

It might be scary,

it might push you,

you might have some great excuses to avoid it,

but in the end, you'll be so glad you followed.

Financial Corner - Vision 2022 Rick Blunk, Business Manager



As was shared on Vision Sunday, the forecast for 2022 is for a deficit of \$26,000. Thankfully we have momentum to build on and this is a gap which can realistically be closed. This \$26,000 figure represents about 10% of our budget, so through maintaining our momentum enjoyed the second half of 2021 and especially December, coupled with some combination of an increase in giving as well as continually searching for cost savings, we can work together to close this gap!

We have been blessed to have several individuals in the second half of 2021 join us in supporting Three Timbers financially which is a true blessing and very exciting. As was shared on Vision Sunday, we are fortunate to have solid reserves as the result of several years of surplus prior to the Covid disruption. To achieve the 10% improvement will most likely come from the following:

- ⇒ Praying God continues to bring individuals to Three Timbers who desire to grow in their faith as we Equip and Engage. As a part of living our faith, we pray individuals will feel called to return a portion of what God has entrusted them with to His service. We are only stewards, not owners, of our finances!
- ⇒ Pray the circumstances of those who currently do not give to Three Timbers will change, allowing them to support the church financially.
- ⇒ Encourage members to consider automating their giving through the PayPal option or a check directly from their bank mailed to the church. When life throws all of us that inevitable curve and it disrupts our attendance, giving tends to be disrupted as well. The church's expenses continue, of course.
- ⇒ Continue to search for cost-saving opportunities. Expenses are generally flat over the years as we have been blessed to take advantage of opportunities to control costs while recognizing most of our expenses are fixed in nature: rent, utilities, insurance, payroll, etc.

It takes financial resources for Three Timbers to Equip and Engage. We are very thankful for the many who joyfully support Three Timbers ministry efforts in northwest Omaha.

Equip & Engage - My Story by Kristen Foster

I grew up in the church going to Sunday service, Sunday school, youth group, etc. It was never forced on me, but always there as I wanted it or needed it. I invited God into my heart at a youth retreat in Branson, MO while Mercy Me sang "I Can Only Imagine." I still love that song to this day.



I have been a member of many different Christian denominations. The important things for me are community and message. Is the message applicable to my everyday life, and do people truly care about me as an individual? My faith has been tested in the past, but never as much as in 2019/2020.

When I first started going through a divorce, I didn't want people in the church to know. I was ashamed, broken and felt like I failed. I know divorce isn't right with God and it isn't something that is talked about in the church. I wanted to hide. It is still difficult to talk about. Many times over the years, I have said the words "why does God do this?" That question was going through my mind once again. I became distant from God and distant from the church during this time. I used COVID as an excuse not to show up. I became frustrated and felt like things were being done to me instead of for me through God. At one point, I began to wonder if what I believed in my whole life was real.

The job I loved and worked so hard for wasn't being flexible with what I needed for my family. The legal system is not at all what I thought it was in America. I had many days where I didn't want to get out of bed, didn't want to do something as simple as showering, didn't want to wake up. I received help for my children. They deserved to still have their mother present. I forced myself to get out of the house, to see people. I felt like there was a hole in my life. Like I was just going through the motions and waiting for the next day to happen.

I chose to come back to church one Sunday. I'm still not quite sure why I made that decision. I had someone ask me to coffee and for some reason I went. She gave me a daily devotional that I held onto for a couple months before cracking it open. I was angry with God, feeling abandoned. When I opened it for the first time, I cried after reading the passage. I cried every day that week knowing that my heart longed for something more. Something bigger than me. I asked God that if He was real, if He would change my life. If He would help me find the joy that was still left, if He would guide me to where I should be.

It took about a year when I had an opportunity to interview for a new position within the hospital where I worked. I prayed that God would give me the position. I wanted out of where I was and I wanted out on my terms... NOW. I was anxious, grasping for anything different. When I got an email a week later saying they went a different direction, it was a blow to my ego. I didn't understand. I had to take a hard look in the mirror.

I was trying to guide my life and not allow God to place me where I should be. I put my head down and worked harder at work, worked harder at home, and worked harder for my kids. Within a short amount of time, I had someone approach me about a position that had recently opened up. They encouraged me to apply for the position. I took some time and prayed about it. I have heard about people hearing God speak to them and I never knew what it meant until now. I spent time in silence with God. I read His word. I waited. I felt a tug on my heart to go through another interview process, if nothing else but for the experience. I struggled some days, but always went back to time with God during this process. I felt a peace I hadn't felt in a while. I felt like I was finally on the right path. I received the job offer and accepted it. It has allowed me to have more time for fellowship with God, more time with people who matter to me and with my kids. I know that God was guiding me, I just had to take the time to listen.

What an amazing morning. Ron Brown is an incredible motivational speaker. God's hands were all over the morning. It was God who brought Ron to us, it was God who put it on the heart of someone to donate a catered breakfast from HyVee and for another to donate door prizes. It was by God's hand that brought the more than 60 men to the Stumble Inn. It was by God's hand that there was a man there from the Open Door Mission who was more than happy to take all the unused food, milk, and juice. While it was the Men's Ministry Team that planned the event, we were just following where God was leading us.

Ron Brown is one of the best speakers I have ever had the privilege to listen to. He can really fire up a room full of men. He spoke for over 30 minutes but it felt like it was only 5 minutes. He spoke about how we are not the "Home Team" here on Earth. As the visitors, the home team is not making us comfortable. They are focused on us before, during, and after we even get on the field. Ron shared many examples from his life how the Home Team made his life uncomfortable from poor condition locker rooms to being booed as soon as he arrived at the game.

He encouraged us to be like the flagpoles around the top of the stadium and not the flags. The flagpoles are firm in their position while the flags are blown in whatever direction the wind is blowing. We were challenged to stand strong against the winds of society. Ron is a humble man who was happy to talk to anyone and everyone. He was one of the last people to leave the event. It was a great morning.

A message from Dr. Chuck Tomek, regarding his recent trip with the HKF team to South Sudan...



A PRESCRIPTION FOR HOPE

I'm currently flying from Entebbe, Uganda, to Brussels, Belgium, the first leg of our long trip home from our mission work in South Sudan. The stewardess walked down the aisle with her cart, asking if the passengers wanted a chicken or fish entree. I chose chicken.

I opened the meal and was disappointed at its meager size. We had been eating rice, plantain, potatoes, and mango the past two weeks. I was hoping for a man sized meal.

I then reflected on many of the hundreds of patients I had cared for during the trip and thought how excited they would have been to have been offered a "meager" meal such as this.

I would go to the clinic at 6:30 every morning to drink coffee, although we didn't see patients until 8. Patients would inevitably be lined up already. "How far had they walked?" I wondered. "Should I share my breakfast with them?" I was hesitant to even glance at them, fearing their stare would guilt me into opening the clinic for business before our regular help arrived.

Once the clinic started, patients would come into my examination room, one by one. They often looked so forlorn, sad, and down trodden. Remember, the patients we saw this time had just returned to their war torn country from the refugee camp in Uganda, having been gone at least four years. Most came home to nothing, as their homes had been destroyed, their livestock killed, and were starting their lives all over. I would take their hand, say "Do pure, gown ada," (Good morning, how are you, in Bari) and they would immediately smile and suddenly become almost vibrant. They didn't come to our clinic asking for a miracle. Their medical requests were for the most part uncomplicated. They simply wanted to know someone cared for them, and would continue to be available for help. Often they were too poor to have shoes, and many wore the only clothes they owned. Most were infected with parasites and/or scabies.

My wife and I would go for long walks every evening into the bush, and out of seemingly nowhere we would meet South Sudanese along the same path, many we had examined that day. We could not see huts in any direction as far as the eye could see. "Where do they live, where did they come from?" we would ask ourselves. And once again, they would smile brightly, apparently happy to see us away from the clinic.

Our trip to South Sudan, in my opinion, gave these people so much hope. So many are fearful the war will break out again, and could do so at any time. When they saw we were willing to come to the clinic, live amongst them, and go trekking into the jungle in the evenings, they believed things would be OK. Oftentimes when people are in the deepest valleys in life, the most precious gift you can provide is hope and I am so very thankful to our Lord that we could offer that.

In this world, so often the rich, famous, and powerful are looked upon as "first", while the poor are often ignored, looked down upon and considered as "last." But in the kingdom of heaven, it's the opposite. Proverbs 9:30 says, "But many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first." This is God's powerful upside down kingdom. I have no doubt our God loving, God fearing brothers and sisters in South Sudan are "first" in the eyes of our Lord and Savior.

I said a prayer before eating my chicken entree, asking the Lord to accept my apology for being upset I'd been offered so little to eat. Thank goodness Christ still loves those of us who are so slow to learn.

Thank you for continuing to support our work in South Sudan with your financial assistance and your prayers. We'll continue to dispense and fill countless prescriptions for medicine, but more importantly, every patient will get a prescription for hope.






Thank you to Dr. Chuck Tomek for sharing this moving experience from a recent trip to Greece.

COME LORD JESUS, PLEASE COME

Last October my wife and I took a trip to Greece. We hired a local tour guide to drive us to Corinth and explain the biblical history of this most amazing place.

Towards the end of the day he pulled the car over alongside a body of water in a village called Kechries. "I'm going to drop you off here," he began. "In biblical times, this town was called

Cenchrea. This shore is where apostle Paul left Greece and set sail for Syria. It's explained in Acts 18:18 if you have any doubt. As Christians, I feel you need to experience this place." He then drove away.



I often reflect on this day and ask the Holy Spirit to give me that peaceful feeling again. I know it will happen when our Lord returns.
